- Misrepresented Scale

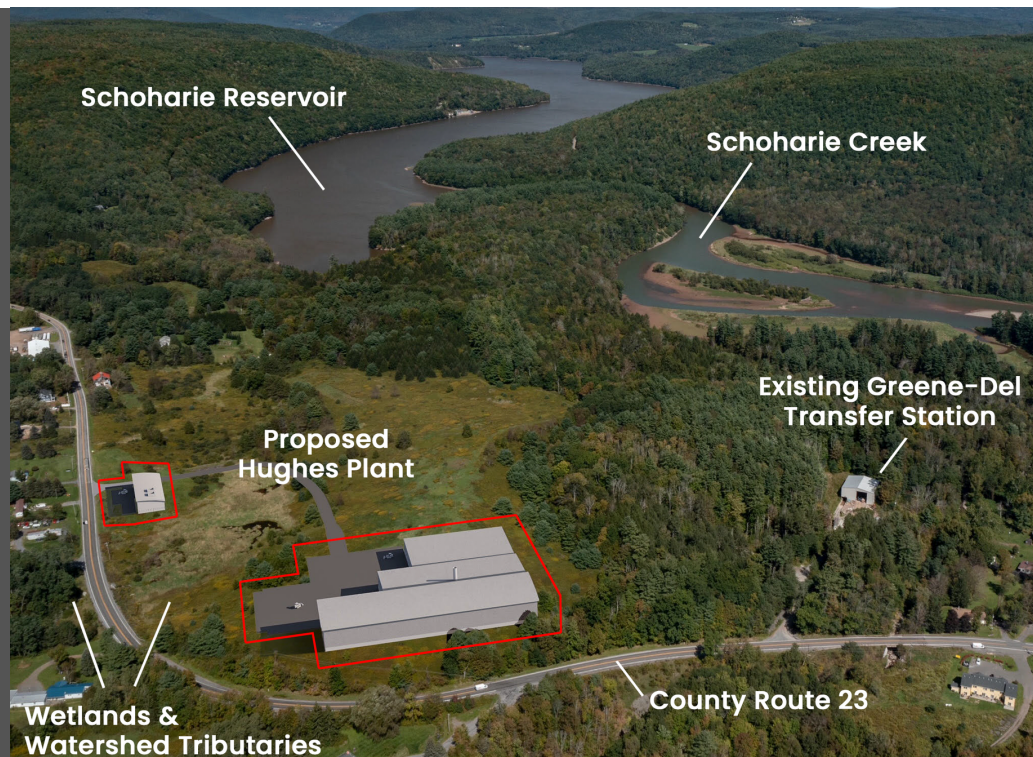
TAKE ACTION!

The NYDEC has required Hughes Energy LLC to produce an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The public comment period is now open through November 30, 2021. Tell the DEC what you think needs to be a part of the Hughes Energy EIS.

Hughes Energy misrepresents that this project would replace the existing Greene-Del Transfer station in location and scale. However, in this architect's rendering we can see that the two proposed buildings are actually positioned on an adjacent lot. At 115,000 sq. ft. and 7 stories high, the proposed waste-to-fuel processing facility clearly dwarfs the existing transfer station.

Positioned less than 2,000 ft. from the Schoharie Reservoir, and directly adjacent to wetlands and watershed tributaries uphill from the Schoharie Creek, the facility location threatens the watershed and drinking water for more than 9 million New Yorkers.
